






## **Project Purpose**


To develop an updated Five-Year FNSB Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS).



CEDS must go through a robust update every five years, with shorter, less intensive updates annually.

## **CEDS** Purpose

A CEDS is a locally-based, regionally-driven economic development planning document that guides local government and community action.



It serves as a road map to economy resilience and prosperity.

## What does a CEDS do?

- Brings the private and public sector together to develop a regional strategy and action plan.
- Identifies projects and makes recommendations to:

Secure and support businesses

Create more and better paying jobs

Improve quality of life

Increase resilience to changes, threats

Numbers that tell the FNSB story – people, economy



- Goal 1: Provide quality customer service with operational efficiency
  - Promote collaboration between departments
  - Establish an exceptional and diverse workforce
  - Reduce risks and exposure to accidents
  - Increase efficiency through technology

- Goal 2: Strive for a safe and clean community
  - Enhance responses to emergencies
  - Implement community policing strategies
  - Improve condition and quality of city streets
  - Provide timely snow removal
  - Provide effective garbage collection and management
  - Ensure safe and compliant construction

- Goal 3: Engage community through effective communication
  - Provide accessible and usable data
  - Increase citizen engagement
  - Provide timely information

- Goal 4: Maintain and ensure strong financial management
  - Promote long-term financial sustainability
  - Maintain basic services while remaining debt free
  - Mitigate risk through financial reserves
  - Identify and implement cost savings operations
  - Achieve recognition for financial and budget reports


